SWOG is one of the nation's largest cancer clinical trials networks that's funded in part by the National Cancer Institute, **with a mission to significantly improve lives through cancer clinical trials and translational research.**

DIRECT RESEARCH SUPPORT



IMPACT AWARD PROGRAM

Grant program encouraging novel and innovative cancer research by supporting early and conceptual stages of these projects.



SECONDARY DATA ANALYSIS

Connects researchers with the statistical support required to conduct database analyses using clinical trials data alone or in combination with registry or claims data, or other potential linkages.



SWOG EARLY EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT (SEED) FUND

Funds preliminary research that will potentially translate to future clinical trials or trial-associated studies.



SWOG TRIAL SUPPORT

Grants funding components of approved and activated studies that require additional support during patient enrollment.

COMMUNITY SUPPORT



CRA/NURSE TRAVEL SUPPORT PROGRAM

Funding awards for CRAs/nurses to travel to oncology conferences.



SPECIAL RECOGNITION AWARDS

Awards to honor outstanding researchers and staff for dedicated service in four key areas – mentorship, humanitarianism, innovation, and patient advocacy.



VA INTEGRATION SUPPORT PROGRAM

Grants addressing the needs of VA Medical Centers that have been challenged by roadblocks to trial participation.

CAREER & PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Virtual Grant Writing Workshop

Virtual program designed for investigators preparing for future grant submissions.

Dr. Charles A. Coltman, Jr., Fellowships

Funding protected time for early career investigators pursuing mentored clinical research initiatives.

Young Investigator Training Course

Multi-day educational intensive in protocol development, trial management, and statistical analysis.

Career Engagement Award Program

Grants to ensure protected time for mid-career investigators pursuing clinical research initiatives.

John Crowley, PhD Award

A one-month residency to interact and collaborate with statistical faculty and data management staff at a leading publicly funded, national multi-center clinical trials organization.

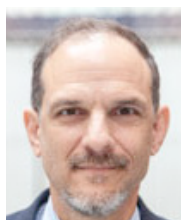
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
