SWOG is one of the nation's largest cancer clinical trials networks that's funded in part by the National Cancer Institute, with a mission to significantly improve lives through cancer clinical trials and translational research.

Cancer impacts everyone—our network of 12,000 members strives to make trials accessible to patients everywhere. The studies conducted through our group have saved more than 3 million years of human life.
